Avington Farm Trip Reminder

In **ICT** the children created a power point presentation to take to the 'Dragon's Den' to bid for funding. They have also used the 2Simple software to create bar graphs and Microsoft Word to create poster for our Enterprise Sale on Friday.

The World's Kitchen



During this week's **Enterprise Week** the children have had a chance to learn about starting their own business by watching a clip from the BBC Junior Dragon's Den. They have had to plan their product, write a letter to conduct market research, collect and interpret the information they received back and use this to plan out the quantity, style and price of their product. They learned about creating a prototype and what the word profit means. They took part in four workshops held by parents and volunteers who have started their own company or designed their own product where they found out more about the process of doing this and were able to ask questions. At each workshop they then were able to take part in an activity linked to the product or business.

In **Numeracy** this week Stingrays have been working out the cost of making their Enterprise Week product and how much profit they will make based on what they chose to sell them at. They have collected data from their market research using a tally chart. After that, they used ICT to present their data and had to think about what titles to give their graphs and the x and y axes. They finished by interpreting their graphs to decide what colours to paint their product, which vegetables and herbs to create labels for and what prices to sell them for.

In **Art** the children finished drawing their own versions of the artist Guiseppe Arcimbold's paintings.
