Literacy

On Monday, we began our new Literacy unit on limericks. We discovered that these humorous poems have 5 lines and follow an AABBA rhyming structure. On Tuesday, we wrote our own limericks about our school, trying to include the key features of these poems. On Wednesday we started planning a limerick about a person we knew. On Thursday, we continued to write a limerick about a person ensuring lines 3 and 4 rhymed. We tried our best to add humour! In our grammar lessons this week we have continued to learn about the importance of the apostrophe. This week the focus was on contractions.

Art

In Art this week, we began to make our paper and paste figures. We first rolled sheets of newspaper and then used these to plait with. We made three plaits - one for the arms and two for the legs of our figure.

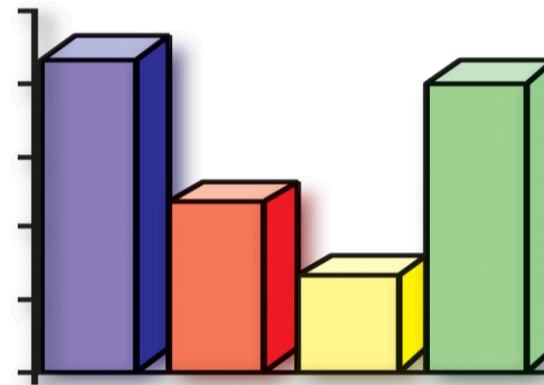
Maths

This week, we continued our unit of work on statistics. On Tuesday, we explored a variety of bar graphs with different scales, and answered questions about the information they represented. On Thursday we read information for a variety of different graphs including pie charts. Using the laptops we created a table of results from our lessons last week using 2Simple Software. Using the program we were able to make a range of different graphs. We also added a title and labelled each axis.

Science

In Science, we started to discuss human skeletons. We drew bones inside an outline of a body where we thought the bones were positioned. We then talked about it in class and looked at a diagram of a skeleton. Finally, we labelled it using the correct names.
