Literacy

On Monday, we continued our play scripts module. We wrote a scene from 'Jack and the Beanstalk', remembering to include the key features that we had identified last week. On Tuesday, we rehearsed our lines for the play and focussed on delivering them with expression. On Wednesday, we discussed pictures drawn by Harris Burdick. During the lesson we created a range of different genres for each picture, we also choice a title for each one. Our next task was to write an opening to the story based on one of the pictures ensuring we included adjectives and powerful verbs. On Thursday, we wrote a persuasive speech to encourage a young soldier to join the Roman army.

Art

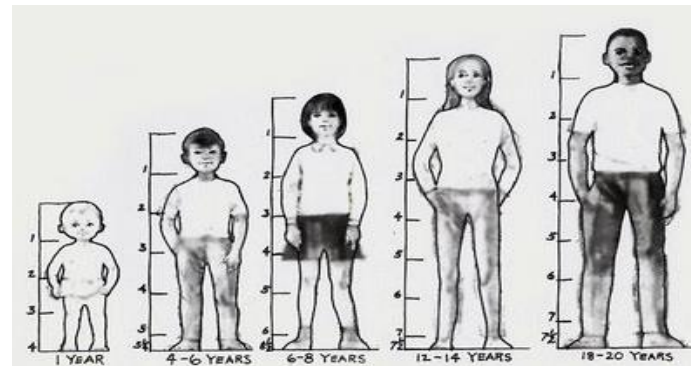
In Art this week, we began our new unit in which we will be making paper and paste models of ourselves! On Monday, we first explored the proportions of the human body, before considering which pose we wanted to create our model in. Maths

On Tuesday, we began our statistics module by exploring a range of tables, tally charts, pictograms, bar charts and line graphs. We identified the information that each represented. On Wednesday, we looked at a pictogram and wrote some sentences to explain what we thought the information was showing us. On Thursday, we continued with our work on graphs but read the information from a range of different line graphs. On Friday, we took on the role of market researchers and worked in groups to design a new name for a product. We used tally charts to collate the feedback on our designs from the class.

Science
