## **Literacy**

This week in Literacy, we have been working on our writing skills. On Wednesday, we looked at a range of dramatic scenes taken at sea. We discussed the vocabulary and suggested a suitable plot for each one. We finished the lesson writing a good opening sentence. We spent the following days planning and writing our own adventure story. We have also performed our Pie Corbett story to the rest of the school.

## **Art**

In Art this week, we evaluated our finished textiles work. We then set about creating our final pieces which we had designed last week. We had to demonstrate the resist technique that we had learnt throughout this Art module in our final piece.

## **Maths**

On Wednesday, the children recapped their compasses points. On Thursday we started learning about coordinates, we identified the location of various objects on grids. Some of us followed a sequence of coordinates to create a 2D shape.

## **Geography**

In Geography this week, we revised what we had learnt this half term about the world. We additionally explored the points of the compass, beginning with the cardinal points - North, East, South and West before moving on to the 16 point compass.

## **PE**

In the final PE lesson the children used all their skills and spent the time playing competitive football against one another.



## **PSHE**

In circle time this week, we have discussed the issue of money. We have talked about why we need money and the reasons for saving it.

## **French**

In French this week, we learnt how to say 'J'aime ....' (I like ....). We also learnt how to pronounce the names of some fruits - 'pomme', 'poire', 'banane' etc. Monsieur Morawek has sent our work about Hambleton off to Reville Primary school in Normandy, so we hope to hear back from the pupils there soon!

## **Music**

In Samba, we have added a question and answer section into the piece of music. We have also included a fourth note: B into our recorder playing and have started reading it on the stave.
