The children really enjoyed making their own dinosaur fossils using clay, a small dinosaur and some potters plaster. The results are very effective.

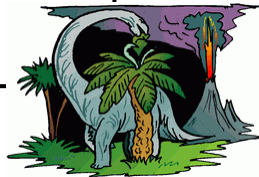


### Science
