## PE

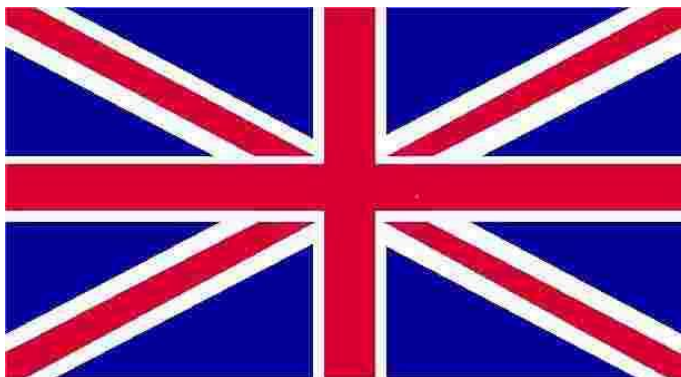
In PE, the children practised throwing for accuracy in preparation for Rounders.
