Progress Data

Progress data is a tool used to measure how well pupils progress from the end of Year 2 to the end of Year 6. A score of 0 indicates pupils have made the progress expected, below 0 would mean they haven't made the progress expected and scores of above 0 mean they have made more than expected progress.

We are very pleased to report that in all three curriculum areas, our scores are above 0. This reflects the hard work made by staff, parents and pupils to ensure that the interruptions due to Covid have not had a negative impact on their education.
