

Week Beginning: 17th March 2014

Literacy

On Monday, we read the chapter of 'The Wind in the Willows' where Toad escapes from prison. We then had to imagine that we were Toad, and we had to write a diary entry recounting the escape. In the next chapter the children read about the battle with the weasels to remove them from Toad Hall. The children wrote their own version of the battle from the point of view of one of the animals. On Thursday, we completed the book and the children gave reasons for their favourite character and their most enjoyable part.

Maths

This week, we have focussed on weight. We began by looking at the units that weight is measured in – kg and g – and explored food items that weighed differing amounts. The children looked at measurements linked to recipes. The children changed the amount of each ingredient in order to serve more people, the children had to either double or half the numbers. The children have used a range of weights to show the total weight of various items.

Geography

We all enjoyed our trip to 'Titchfield Haven Nature Reserve' on Tuesday. We were able to gain first hand experience of some of the features of the River Meon. The children particularly enjoyed the pond dipping activity, and were able to identify many of the creatures that they found.



French

The children continued to learn items found in the classroom particularly ones found in a pencil case. This week they also learnt the days of the week.

Geography

Following on from the trip the children identified the location of the River Meon on a map. They have also written key features about the visit.

Music

The children have been learning to accompany a song using percussion instruments in preparation for the Music Concert.
