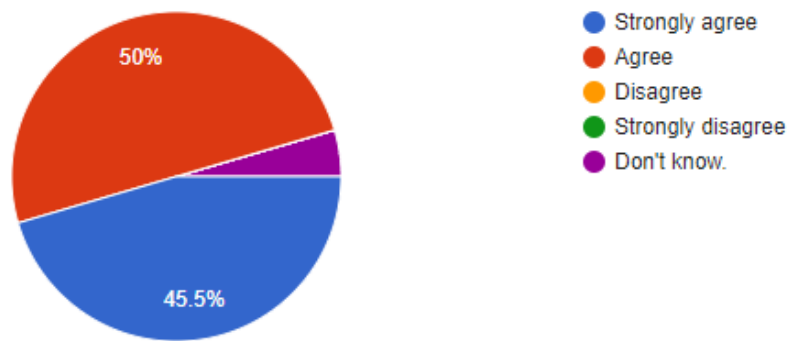

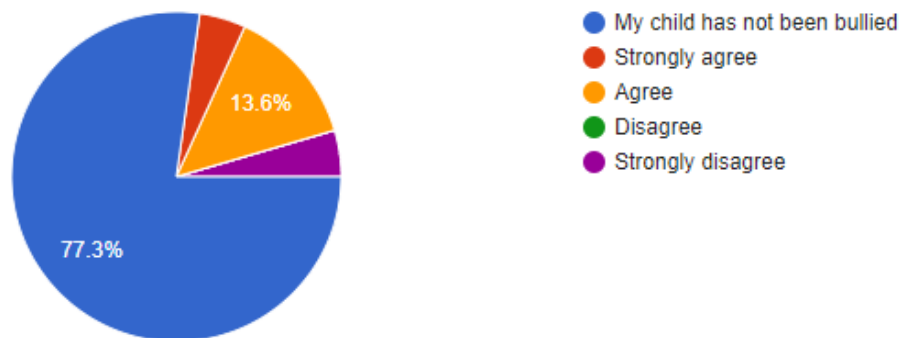

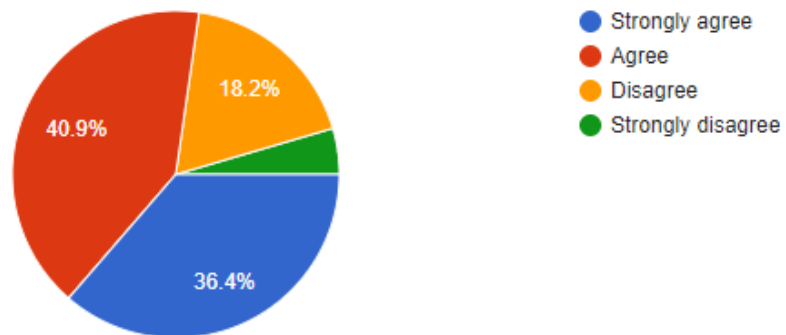

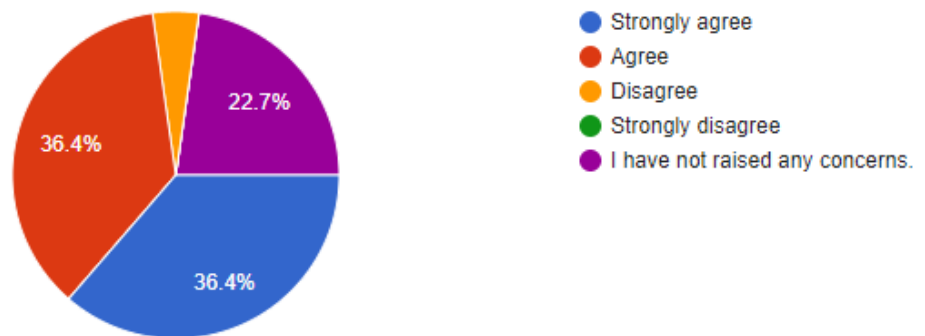

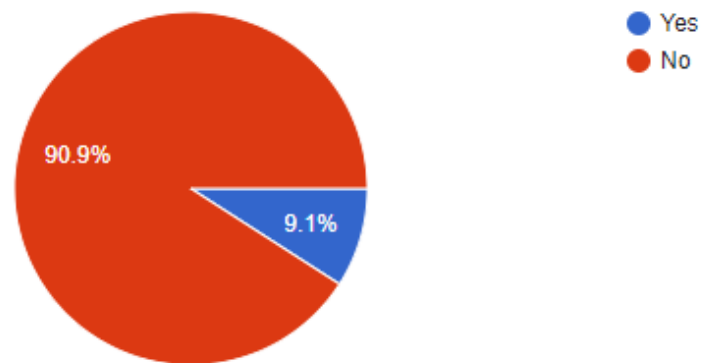

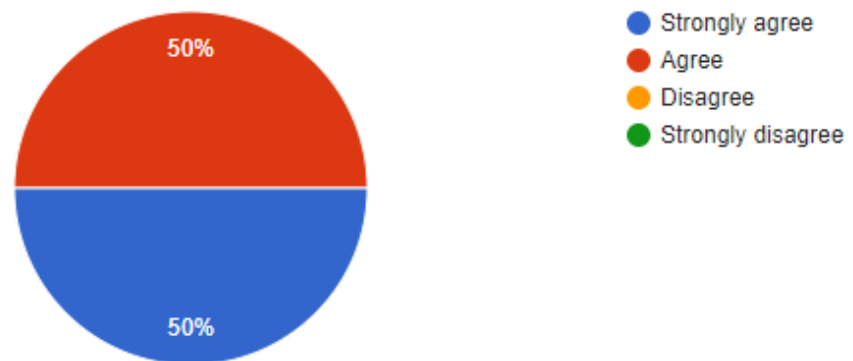

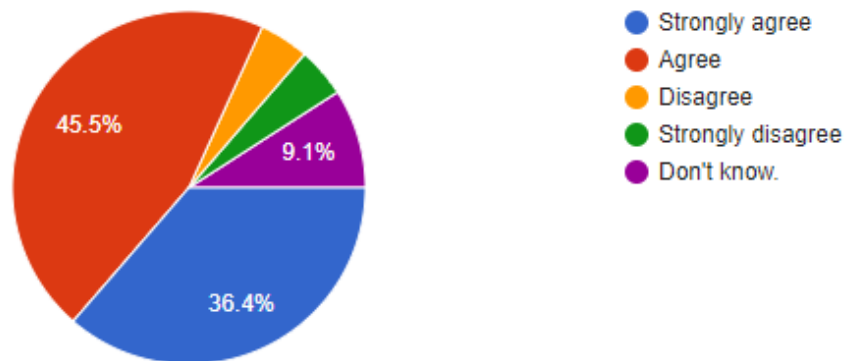

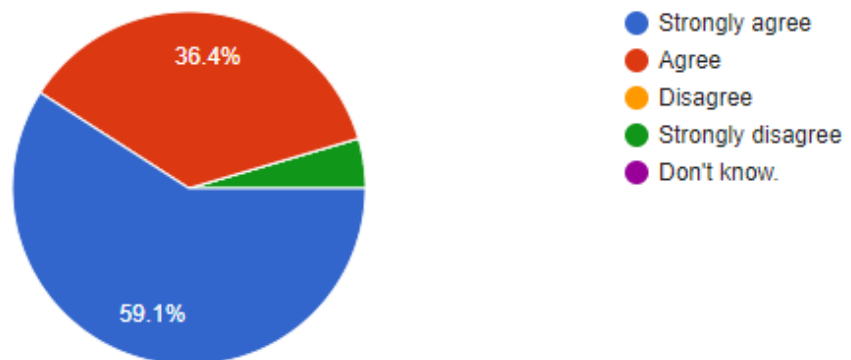

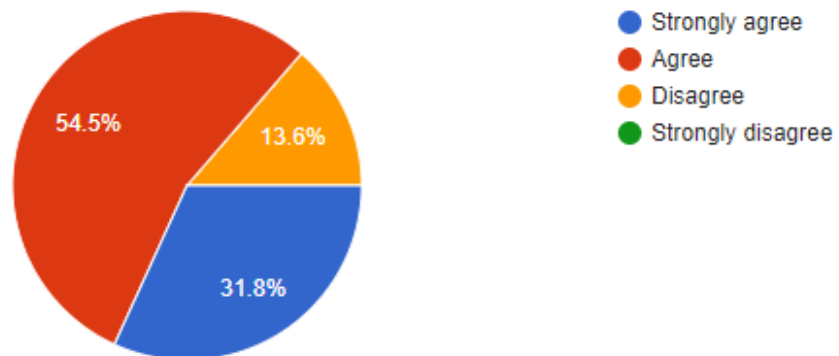

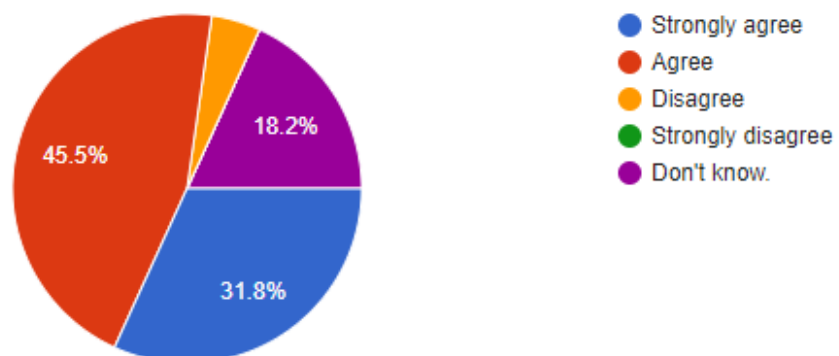

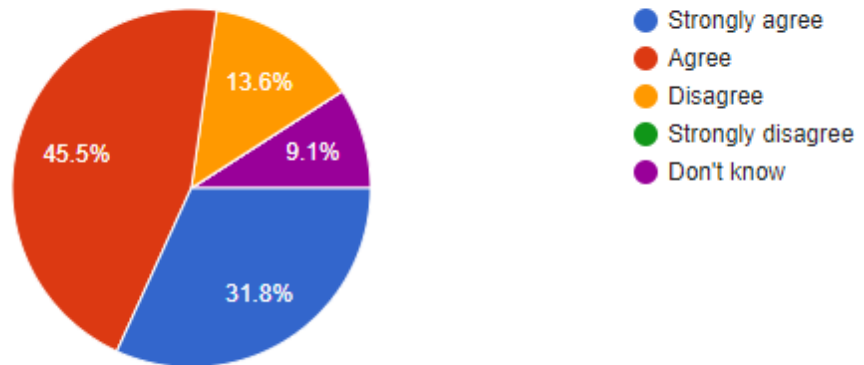
There is a good range of subjects available to my child at this school.

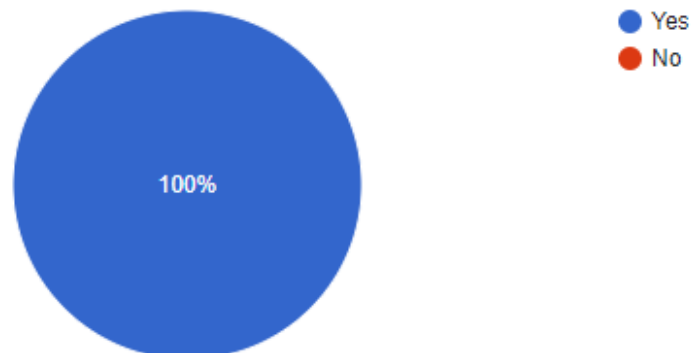

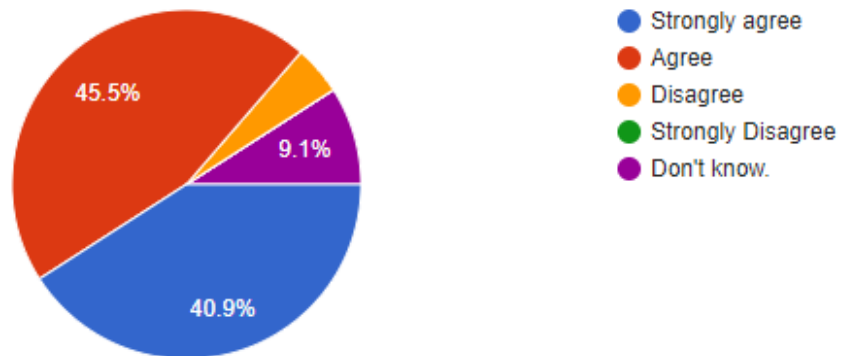

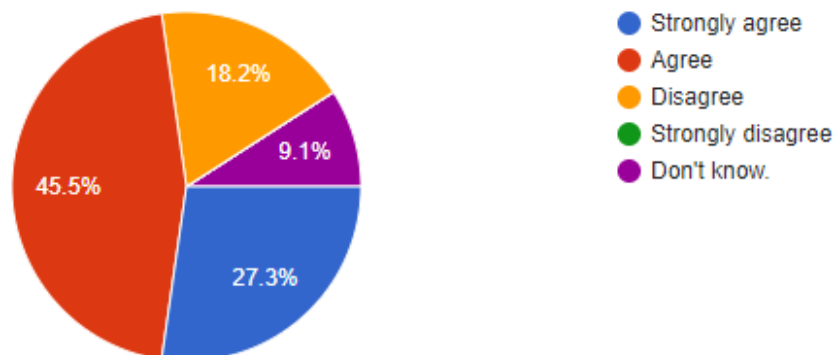

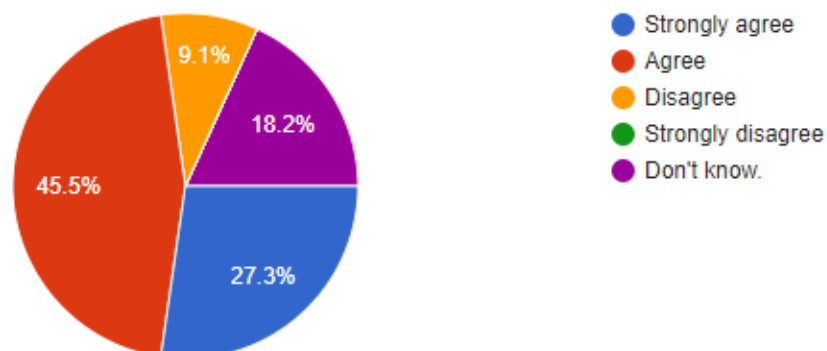

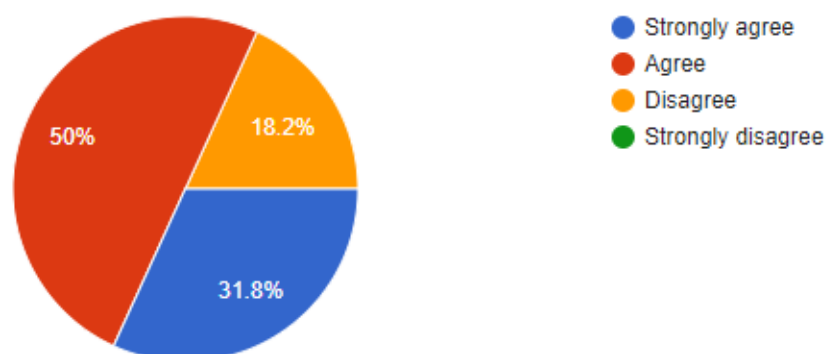

Diversity

Wrap around care, I know this isn't easy to organise but would be really beneficial to the families where both parents are in full time employment.

Engagement with the village (who fully support the school).

*Ensuring all pupils get recognition for their achievements both inside and outside of school. (Ensuring it's not just pupils of staff, Governors and Friends who get selected for events/extras, newsletters, website and social media posts.)

*Performance schedule so all pupils have a chance to perform with an option to attend virtually for those who can't physically attend, eg concerts, plays, etc.

*Additional school trips, eg perhaps termly if possible, to increase opportunities for all

*Covid restrictions aside, having more of an open door policy where parents and volunteers feel welcomed into school, not kept at arm's length, as it has been under previous head! (Mrs Blower is already making the school feel more welcoming...)

Continue after school activities and broaden these where possible

Breakfast & after school clubs would be handy although I know this is very tricky to arrange.

Sports

More outdoor learning opportunities, sport daily - later pick up circa 4pm giving the children the opportunity to do sport daily
